# WHAT IS SPECIAL ABOUT ST. PAUL'S CMG SITE?

- **Location** - Urban Inner City location with most rotations and learning experiences accessible by bike, public transit or walking.
- **Patients/Communities served** – working with and learning from people who bear the health burdens of systemic racism, oppression, colonization, structural violence and marginalization. Focus on strengths and lived experiences.
- **Equity Lens** – Aiming for attention to justice, equity, diversity, inclusion and anti-oppression in all aspects of our clinical, curriculum, scholarship and educational environments.
- **Approach to Residents** – Aiming for learner-centred, wellness-oriented supports for all residents.
- **Schedule**
  - R1 block rotations for basics;
  - R2 self-directed adult learning approach for flexibility, autonomy, control over R2 scheduling to maximize career goals and interests (need to have good administration and organizational skills!)
- **Continuity of Alumni** – graduates of our site often return as highly engaged preceptors, site faculty, academic speakers, research mentors and leaders at our site (and beyond!)
